Undergraduate:

CSD Scholarship - \$500 – One scholarship of up to \$500 is available to undergraduate students who have a history of high scholarship and demonstration of academic and clinical potential as well as financial need. Due by 4/1.

Fairhaven Lions Scholarship: - \$1,000 is awarded to an undergraduate CSD student, minoring in Audiology, who plans a career working with the hearing impaired. Preference will be given to students with demonstrated academic excellence and financial need.

Paul Woodring Scholarship: - \$3,000 (\$1,000 each quarter) is awarded “without regard to race, sex or religion, but to those students who, in the judgment of faculty members who know them, seem most likely to make substantial contributions to mankind as a result of their liberal education.” One student can be nominated per department. Application Form must be submitted by the deadline date with proper attachments. (see department secretary for App. Form. Application is due to CSD 3/30, due in the Humanities and Social Sciences Dean’s office 4/23 with a supporting letter from the department and a transcript.

Sam Polen Memorial Scholarship for Audiology Students: \$1,000 awarded annually (when funds are available) to a student enrolled in CSD’s minor in Audiology and majoring in CSD and who plan a career in Audiology will be given preference. The award is given for financial need as well as academic excellence. Completed scholarship applications are due to the department in spring quarter of every year. Scottish Rite Undergraduate Scholarships:

To qualify for the Scottish Rite Scholarship Program, you must be a full-time student at WWU, a US citizen, a Washington State resident and have at least a 3.0 GPA. Most scholarship awards are for \$1,500 except the top 10% are for \$2,000 and the top 2 receive \$2,500. Application deadline is 15 March 2008. An interview is required.
